




Bear River Bottoms I SPY

BONUS ROUND - Can you find these plants?

- Coyote Willow - 10 feet tall pole-like trees, narrow pale green leaves, smooth bark
- Golden Currant Bush - a woody bush, 3-5 feet tall, with gold blossoms
- Russian Olive - A tree with teal-silver leaves and **THORNS** and rough bark
- Phragmites - A grass with a fluffy top, 8' tall!!!
- Dyer's Woad - A 'bolting' plant about 2-3' tall
 - SPRING: A bright yellow plant in spring with green seeds hanging down
 - SUMMER/FALL: Blackened brittle seeds hanging from a dry, stiff stem
- Hemlock - 5-9 feet tall, spotted stem, **don't eat it! (Best not touch it either!)**
- Thistle - A weed with sharp spines! Be careful!
 - How many different types can you find? 1 2 3 4 5
- Blue Flax flowers - a tough ground plant with pretty blue flowers
- Showy Milkweed - *carefully* look for pointed, creme-colored Monarch caterpillar eggs on the bottom
